We are extremely pleased with how well the children have settled into back into school after the Christmas break. They worked extremely hard on their DT projects last week. We have included a list of topics and a brief explanation for what we will be covering during each one in the table below.

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	Climate Change	We will learn what Climate Change is, what is causing it and what we can do to help.
ICT	Creating Media: History of computers	We will learn how to record, edit and add sound effects to a radio play and understand how computers have changed and impacted the modern world.
Art & DT	Painting and Mixed Media: An Artist Study	We will developing our understanding of a variety of artists and using a range of media to create a picture in the style of David Hockney
	Cooking: Come Dine with Me	Design and cook a three course meal.

Reading

All children at Uffculme Primary School are expected to read at least 3 times a week, for 1 hour 30 minutes in total, at home. Please ensure your child does this and please sign their Reading Record Book to show that they have read. Dojos will be awarded for completed reading.

Spelling

Children will be given 10 spellings on a Monday. They need to learn them using the look, cover, write, check method which is in their homework book. They may also use a different method if they need further practise. Children will be tested on their spellings the following week. Spelling homework will not be marked but the child's test score will be recorded, and they will be awarded a Dojo for completing their homework. Children will still have access to Doodle Spell if they wish to do extra spelling homework.

SATS revision books

Children are expected to complete a **double page of their Grammar Revision Book** and a **double page of their Maths Revision Book** each week. They can do more if they wish. Please can you sign their Reading Record Book to show if they have completed it. 1 Dojo will be given for each double page completed. Once children have finished their books, they can recap any areas that they are unsure of.

If children do not complete their homework at home, they will be given an opportunity to complete their homework in homework club on a Thursday lunchtime. If their homework is not completed they will attend reflection on a Friday lunchtime.

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Water bottles and snack

Please can you send a water bottle into school every day for your child. (Please do not send in Air Up bottles) It is really important that they have access to water throughout the day and a bottle in the classroom ensures that water is readily available (no squash or juice please). Please label the bottle with your child's name. If your child would like a snack at break time, they can bring in a piece of **fruit or veg** from home.

PE lessons will be taken by Mr Carpanini and will be on a Monday and Friday. Children will need to have their PE kit in school on these days. A reminder that your child needs black shorts, red polo-shirt, and daps. When the weather is colder, they may need black tracksuit bottoms. Please ensure that all PE kit is clearly labelled and carried in a named bag. For health and safety reasons, jewellery must be removed for P.E; this includes earrings.
